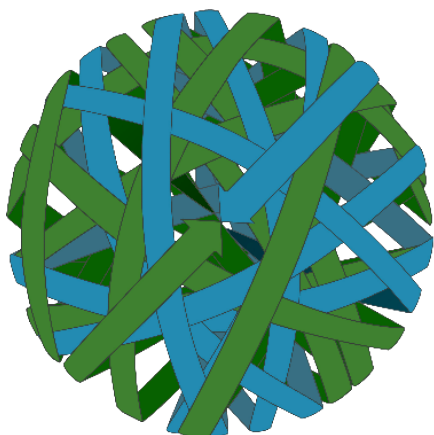

ONE WORLD YOUTH PROJECT



One World Youth Project

Building leadership among university students by empowering them as teachers and mentors to youth in their communities.

One World Youth Project is a unique 3-semester global leadership and professional development opportunity for university students. The One World Youth Project program engages university students as facilitators of a global competence curriculum in local secondary school classrooms. Through the program, university students facilitate cross cultural connections among youth in different parts of the world through social media.

One World Youth Project transforms university students into 21st century leaders through innovative trainings that build responsible global citizenship among the next generation, empowering students with crucial life-skills needed in today's increasingly globalized world.

How It Works

With each partner university, OWYP establishes a service-learning program—a One World Hub—on their campus for the benefit of their students as well as the surrounding secondary school system.

In each university, OWYP trains a team of exceptional university students to teach and mentor youth in their communities. Through in-person and remote trainings, university students learn how to facilitate wired cultural exchange between local secondary school classrooms and other OWYP classrooms abroad.

One World Youth Project engages university students in a leadership experience over three-semester.



In the Spring, OWYP university student participants enroll in an online training course, through which university students build expertise in the topics that they will be teaching in secondary schools. Two promising student leaders from the campus are selected to receive a paid Project Manager Fellowship opportunity to serve a special role as student coordinators of their university's One World Hub team.



During the summer, the two Fellows from each campus travel to a five-day training conference with their counter-parts from around the world. They receive training in management in facilitation skills, as well as how to be effective leaders on their campus. At the beginning of the following fall semester, OWYP staff visits each campus to lead an in-person training on techniques for cross-cultural facilitation in secondary school classrooms.

After this training, the Fellows work with the rest of their university team to lead weekly sessions at a local secondary school.

University students lead an OWYP Global Competence curriculum that covers three units: (1) Cross Cultural Questions & Communication, (2) Interconnectedness & Collaboration and, (3) Community Worth & Positive Change. The university mentors adapt OWYP's global competence activities to meet local curriculum standards, and connect their classrooms with other classrooms abroad through video, voice, letters and the internet over the course of fifteen weeks.



A One World Hub Includes...



Partnership to establish your university as an anchor institution for the surrounding community

- Managed and facilitated partnership with a local secondary school.
- The opportunity for university students to work weekly for two semesters in local secondary schools classrooms as One World Project Ambassadors, facilitating a global competence curriculum and cross-cultural connections between local secondary school classrooms and partner classrooms abroad.
- Aggressive outreach to local print, broadcast and online media outlets to showcase your university's positive engagement with local secondary school classrooms through One World Youth Project.

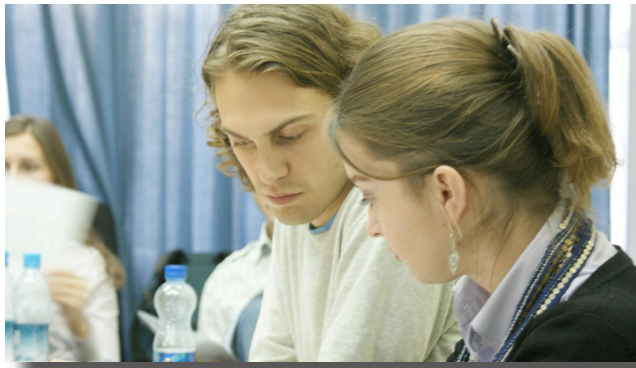
Project Manager Fellowship

- A competitive leadership and professional development opportunity for two exceptional students to serve as coordinators of their university's One World Hub.
- Up to a \$1,000* service award and the opportunity to receive bonuses depending on student innovation to expand their Hub, build stronger ties with their international partners and make their university known as a positive actor in the local community.
- Fellows attend an all-expense paid Summer Training Conference in the United States valued at over \$1500 USD per Fellow.

Recruitment

- Customized recruitment process of student participants.
- Managed review and competitive selection of One World Project Project Fellows.
- Media releases sent to national and international press outlets announcing that two students from your university have been chosen for a prestigious global fellowship.

Consistent Support

- Strategic consulting on how the One World Youth Project program can best enhance existing campus efforts.
- Consistent One World Youth Project staff support for participating university students, faculty and local middle/high school educators.
- A weekly phone conference between the One World Project Managers and OWYP staff.
- A network of participating university students from around the world to collaboratively share best practices.

Global Exchange Toolkit

- An 3-unit secondary school curriculum covering Cross-Cultural Questions & Communication, Interconnectedness & Collaboration, and Community Worth & Positive Change. This curriculum includes a full set of lesson plans that are adaptable to various environments.
- Training manuals, accompanying curriculum resources and online tools.
- An online intranet for global collaboration among participating university students around the world.
- An innovative Chatfé service that allows students to connect via cell phone across countries free of charge. This service is valued at \$1,000 USD for a year of usage.
- Two Kodak Play-Full cameras valued at \$150 USD each.

Comprehensive Training

- A multi-week training course to prepare your students for their role as One World Project Ambassadors in local classrooms. This rigorous online course covers education theory, international development practices related to the UN Millennium Development Goals, classroom management skills, project-based lesson planning and assessment, community mapping, service-learning ideology, media literacy and cross-cultural competency. Assignments engage students with topics they will be exploring with their middle and high school students the upcoming academic year.
- Airfare and accommodations for your campus's two One World Project Managers to attend the One World Summer Training Conference. During this conference, university Project Managers take part in a specialized training and meet their counter-parts around the world.

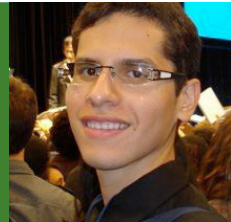
